

ELIGIBILITY TO SELL

Participating artists must be current members of SCAA. If your membership is due to expire during the sale, you must rejoin as a member of SCAA at time of sale registration. All current members are invited and encouraged to sell their work in this sale.

NEW INFORMATION ~ CHANGES ~ CLARIFICATION

New

LEAVE ONE/TAKE ONE

This activity encourages artists to share and exchange their art. At the end of the sale, each artist is invited to leave one of their pieces of unsold art. If you leave a piece of your art on the designated share table, you may take a piece of someone else's art from the table.

Unless they're in a basket, all other small 3-D items/pottery items less than 3" overall will be displayed together in an alternate area on the sales floor.

The commission split for all work sold has been updated to 60% to the artist with 40% to SCAA. Please price accordingly.

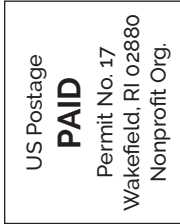
Registration fee and volunteer reimbursement return to pre-50th Anniversary schedules.

DROP-OFF

- After unpacking your work, please remove all packaging from the building (boxes, tote bags, etc).
- It is highly recommended and preferred that artists drop off extra inventory at same time of initial drop off.
- Extra inventory is to be placed in the Inventory Hallway. Historically, the highest sellers in the sale are those artists who have periodically, throughout the sale, dropped off extra inventory.
- Inventory sheets are highly recommended as a way of tracking work sold.

LIABILITY

All artwork will be handled with all possible care. SCAA is not responsible for damage or theft occurring during set-up or sale.

CALL FOR INVENTORY!

All artists are encouraged to bring in additional inventory throughout the sale and place in the back hallway and/or little storage/mug room. NOTE: Only the shift volunteers and staff are allowed to rearrange, relocate, remove or place new merchandise on the floor during the sale.

PICK-UP

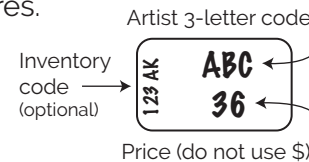

Either the artist or a responsible designated person must remove all unsold work & inventory no later than 5pm on Dec. 20. Commission checks will be distributed only after your unsold art and inventory is removed.

LABELS ~ PRICING ~ SALES

- **Required:** Each item of art must be marked with the price and your artist's three-letter ID code.
- Pricing labels/stickers must be removable and indicate the required info. (see graphic). We suggest using Avery #5424 Removable Stickers, found at office supply stores.



- Tags with strings must display a removable price sticker with the required pricing information.
- A set/grouping of items being sold together requires specific price sticker information: ["set 1 of 2"] ["2 of 2"] with price indicated on only one item in the set/grouping. ("2 for ..." pricing is not allowed in this sale).
- If price-tag/sticker falls off, item will be removed from sales floor. Price-sticker must be replaced by artist.
- The commission split for all work sold in this Holiday Sale is 60% to the artist with 40% to SCAA.

ELIGIBLE ARTWORK

New, original fine art is eligible to be sold - includes prints (limited edition), paintings, drawings, photography, pottery, sculpture, woven textiles, collage, jewelry and handmade cards. Not eligible are t-shirts, knit/crochet items, plants w/soil. No seconds may be sold at any point during the sale. Old artwork art is appreciated but not recommended.

POTTERY

- At initial set-up, fifteen (15) pieces of pottery for each artist will be displayed.
- Each potter may display unlimited mugs and ornaments, and two (2) regulation baskets for small items.
- The following pottery must be clearly identified on an additional/separate label attached to the pot: Raku, Wood & Pit fired; and identify pottery that is "not food safe."

2-D ART ~ FRAMED

- At initial set-up, maximum of 10 sq.ft of art will be hung/displayed per artist.
- All 2-D art must be framed & wired with picture-hanging wire. No piece may exceed 16" x 20" .
- Framed prints and photography prints must be signed 'individually'. No posters, calendars, bookmarks, etc.

2-D ART ~ UNFRAMED

- Must be matted and protected with plastic.

JEWELRY ~ SMALL ITEMS

- Small items may be packaged in individual display bags - sandwich bags are not allowed.
- Small, separate personal jewelry displays are allowed but subject to committee approval & each display is counted as one (1) basket (see below).

BASKETS ~ DISPLAYS

- Regulation SCAA baskets are allowed to display items. Baskets are available for sign-out in the office.
- Maximum of two (2) table displays/baskets are allowed per artist.
- Baskets and display props must be dropped off with initial inventory.
